PROFILES

Birdie Schmidt Larrick, greatly adored manager of the ARC Aero Club, joined the Group at Wendling December 12, 1943. These were dark days, and she was a ray of sunshine.

Fresh from Ohio State University with experience in radio broadcasting and theater, she and her ARC staffers brought a moraleboosting sense of home to the base.

One of the crews named their ship, The Birdie Schmidt.

Hearing the boom of guns on the continent, she left Wendling in February 1945, running a cinemobile and a showmobile for the Ninth Army, and later she put on Special Services shows for the Seventh Army. Birdie arrived home in the USA on November 5, 1945.

Post-war, she worked at a Columbus, Ohio radio station, tried out "show business" in New York, then married George "Bud" Larrick a Pan Am pilot.

Bud and Birdie moved to Florida in 1965 and Birdie taught high school English. They raised two boys, Don and Jay. Bud died in 1983; Birdie sold out in 1985 and went home to Columbus (1928 Beverly Road, Zip 43221, 614/448-2689).

But that address will not be good for very much longer. What's she doing now? Going to China to teach English in a Chinese University! When pressed for "Why" at this state in her life, she only said, "Because I want to"! Relentless logic.

The Board of Directors met and discussed the possibility of making some improvements to the area surrounding our memorial at Wendling. The Board did approve funds to do some drainage work around the monument. Director C. W. Cheek visited that area last year and he has recommended some general improvements there. Luther Beddingfield will be in Wendling during August and will give us a report on costs etc.

The Board voted to hold our own reunion. It will be next June in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The 2nd ADA will hold their 1987 reunion in Norwich, England; however, attendance is limited to about 500 people because of the limited facilities there. The Board felt the timing was right to have our own reunion. Tulsa was chosen because of its central location as well as the attractive pricing. The rates will be very reasonable.
