# SON AUTHORS BOOK ABOUT FATHER, KIA

2/Lt William C. McGuire was the navigator on the 579th's Sharpe crew and was KIA on the infamous Friedrichshafen mission March 18, 1944.

Now comes William C. McGuire II, whose book After the Liberators: A Father's Last Mission, A Son's Lifelong Journey, will be published in late October, 1999. Provisions will be made for it to be available from the 392BGMA PX.

The author pieced together his father's story after interviews with Crusader survivors and visits to Wendling, the St. Avold, France, cemetery where his dad is buried, and Ettenheimmunster, Germany, where the Sharpe a/c and two other bombers crashed.

Interviewees were Cliff Peterson, H. Malcom Hinshaw, Vern Baumgart, Bob Berger, John Bode, Ken Parks, Howard Bjork, Delmar Johnson, James Ross, as well as the late Col Myron Keilman, Mike Cugini, and Chester Strickler.

Each of the 14 392<sup>nd</sup> a/c lost or forced down in Switzerland, France, and German is described in some detail.

# VETERANS, 2<sup>ND</sup> AND 3<sup>RD</sup> GENERATIONS FIND INFORMATION ABOUT THE 392ND

The website has been in operation only a few months, but already some 2000 people have visited it. It is reported that it now receives about 50 "hits" per day.

It was developed by four second generation Crusaders: Bob Books, Jim Marsteller, Ben Jones, and Greg Hatton

Books is the son of 1/Lt Dallas Books, a 579<sup>th</sup> pilot KIA on the Fredrichshafen mission. He is a professional computer programmer.

Jim Marsteller is the nephew of S/Sgt Everette Morris, the engineer on the Books crew, also KIA.

Ben Jones is a Wendling area product who has been active in Crusader affairs since he was a teen-ager.

Greg Hatton's father was Sgt Hyman Hatton, waist gunner on the Ofenstein crew in the 576<sup>th</sup>. His ship went down on the Berlin mission of April 29, 1944, and Hatton was one of five crewmen who survived, to become POW's.

Hatton was struck in the back with a rifle butt by a German guard, and carried his injuries to an early death in his fifties.

(Greg Hatton has written two books covering the experiences of his father while in training, in combat, and while a POW. The works are an exhaustive story of how a young soldier trained for and fought the war and endured great hardships as a POW.)

The website developers are looking for Crusaders who kept some sort of diary during their stay at Wendling. Although this was forbidden, many people did keep a diary, and Books and friends would like use them to supplement the data already on the website.

They emphasize that they are not looking for someone to write a story as they remember it now, they want only material that was written during that time period. The diaries will be returned to the sender after the research team reviews it for possible inclusion to the site.

The website now includes 392<sup>nd</sup> information on the Memorial Association, overseas burials, mission summaries, casualty lists, a great deal of POW information, and the Wendling base. Many photos and drawings are included. More information is being posted to the site almost daily.

The site has a simple name which is easy to call up: B24.NET. If you have access to a computer, give it a look.





citing a photo of Maj Percy Caley, Group S-2, which appeared in the February issue. He said that in the winter of '43 or '44 he was just out of school and driving a horse and cart delivery for a local grocer. Maj Caley's jeep and Denis' cart had a collision in East Dereham, and fortunately no one, including the horse, was hurt.

(Editor's note: As Group Transportation Officer, I can testify that this was not the only wreck that occurred around the base while we were there. By a long shot.) Aug. 4, 1944: Radio-controlled bombers first used in missions flown against V-1 rocket sites.




