

PROFILE

Col. Joseph Bush is a native of Salem, Ohio. All of us remember him as Group Executive Officer of the 392nd BG at Wendling. Col. Bush joined our group in March of 1943 at Alamogordo, New Mexico. At the close of WW II, he headed the effort to have a lasting memorial erected in Wendling. He currently serves on our Memorial Committee.

His 36 years of distinguished service can't be covered in this short profile. He served as AB Group Commander of the 5th Fighter Wg in Japan and took his group to Korea for a short period. He was commander of several other groups and wings. service with General Nathan Twining who was Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of staff. He attended the Air University at Maxwell In 1959, he was assigned as Wing AFB. Commander, 6950th Sec. Wing in Chicksands RAF, England. During this period, Col. Bush made several visits back to Wendling to check on our memorial and to visit old friends.

Col. Bush retired from the service in 1967 and became a banker for the next 12 years. He currently resides with his lovely wife, Robena (of 46 years), in San Angelo, Texas. The following are his comments on the 392nd Bomb Group.

"The dedication and outstanding performance of a group of young, dedicated people will always remain in my memory of the 392nd BG. The exploits of the flying personnel on the missions were so commendable that it makes me proud to be associated with such an outstanding group. The teamwork ground personnel was equally commendable. Many of the support duties were not glamorous, but were done with a "bust your butt" dedication. These people, our cooks, clerks, air police, motor pool, maintenance, PX, clubs, bomb dump, supply, and so many others made the 392nd and its attached units truly a class outfit. dedication to those of our unit who paid the supreme price also makes me proud, and I am so pleased that the 392nd BG Memorial is increasing its support of our memorial to them at Wending."
