We have a number of inquiries about both the Second Air Division Ass'n. and the 8th Air Force Historical Society. In this and subsequent issues, we will attempt to tell you about these two fine groups and their projects.

# 2nd AD Association

At the close of WWII, members of the 2nd AD donated funds with which to build a memorial room in the proposed library in Norwich, England.

In 1947, a group of former 2nd AD mem got together in Chicago for a mini-reunion. Unbeknown to them, a group of 2nd AD Headquarters WAACS were meeting in Chicago at the same time. As luck would have it, these two groups met on Chicago's main drag and the two reunions became one. They had such a good time reminiscing, they decided to meet again the next year. They did meet and the Association was born.

One of their first actions was to contact the Memorial Trust (England) to determine the status of the 2nd AD Memorial. They were told that because of the extensive damage Norwich had sustained, it would be several years before the library, which was to contain a "Memorial Room" could be constructed.

The monies in the trust were invested and reinvested until 1963, The library was built containing the 2nd AD Memorial Room. Over the years, donations in the form of books and money have expanded to the point that it is now truly a "Living Memorial". It is a window on America, as it was intended to be, and it is a project of which we can all be proud.

More recently, members of the 392nd BG who belonged to this group sponsored the drive to raise funds for our own 392nd BG Memorial at the Air Force Museum in Dayton, OH.

The 2nd AD has a reunion each year. In 1984, it was held in Palm Springs, Calif. In 1985, they were in McAfee, New Jersey. In 1986, they will meet in St. Charles, Ill. (near Chicago). In 1987, they planto return to Norwich, England and a trip to the Memorial Room in the Library. We urge all of you to attend the reunions when possible.

The 2nd Air Division Journal is published quarterly for its membership. Dues are \$10.00 per year and entitle you to receive the publication.

# 8th Air Force Historical Society

The 8th Air Force Clearing House was formed in late 1974. Out of this, the 8th AF News was born, January 1975. In May of 1975, the Eighth AF Historical Society was founded beginning with 160 subscribers of the 8th AF News. It has grown ever since at a rapid rate, passing 15,000 members this year.

The 8th AF Historical Society was founded to perpetuate the history of the 8th Air Force and to provide opportunities for 8th AF veterans to get together. The Society maintains a clearing house to reunite lost 8th AF veterans with their unit organizations.

They sponsor an annual reunion. The 1984 reunion was in Los Angeles, California. This past year, it was in Wichita, Kansas. October of 1986 will find them in Hollywood Florida.

The 8th Air Force Memorial at the Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio was sponsored by this group. They have conducted tours to England for their members.

In 1977, the 8th AFHS founded the 8th Air Force Memorial Museum Foundation to fulfill the purpose of perpetuating the history of the 8th Air Force. The two organizations are linked by members who serve on the Board of Directors of both organizations. They have established 8th AF exhibits in various air museums. They also sponsor the Mighty Eighth Theater and the annual Air-War Symposia in conjunction with the annual reunion. The have produced a number of books concerning the Eighth Air Force.

The dues are \$10.00 annually, and this entitles you to the quarterly publication of the 8th AF News.
