MEMORIAL FUND NOTE FROM GIL GILBERT AND CARROLL CHEEK

Our sincere thanks and appreciation to all who responded to our December letter appeal for funds for the Memorial and to all our earlier contributors. Particularly gratifying is the doubling of the number of contributors since September to well over 200 and the increase in the fund to more than \$50,000. This is, or was, within sight of our original estimate of \$60,000 needed to start the first phase.

The Memorial Committee has recently received a revised cost estimate from the Battle Monuments Commission which reflects the impact of the sinking dollar vs. pound exchange rate. The Commission's latest estimate also includes the VAT (Value Added Tax) and a 10% surcharge for the services of the Comm ission. The bottom line is that our original estimate of \$60,000 has inflated to more than \$70,000. Carroll Cheek and committee will review the design plans to determine where cost cuts might be made, what items could be deferred, etc. Their prime objective will be to maintain the quality and durability features specified in the original plans for the obelisk and its new granite elevated base. Alternate proposals for landscaping, fencing and parking will also be studied with a view to accomplishing as much as possible within our budget.

Another update will come in the May Newsletter and more at our June reunion in Colorado Springs.
