The Sunday night banquet will offer a long overdue tribute to our old Warbird and her people who performed so magnificently in defeating the enemy while receiving little

THE PROJECT IS UNDERWAY! Formal authorization was given in January to the American Battle Monuments Commission to proceed with the rehabilation work for our monument. Authority has also been given to our own Tom Scott of Beeston to serve as general contractor with responsibility to negotiate with subcontractors for various phases of construction. The Battle Monuments Commission has also been authorized to contract with the Beeston Parish Council for perpetual maintenance of the site. In addition to preparing detailed plans and specifications, the Commission will periodically inspect the work and report on the progress.

Approval by the Commission for Tom Scott to serve as general contractor is a major plus and we feel fortunate that he has consented to assist us in this key role. We are confident he will be able to complete the work at the lowest cost with no sacrifice in the high standard of quality we desire.

Carroll Cheek will visit the Beeston area again in late February for further coordination of details with Mr. Scott and local government officials.


Monument Fund Drive

Profile

Lt. Luther Beddingfield was the navigator on Carrol Cheek's crew, 578th. He joined the Group at Wendling in May 1944, and flew 33 missions. After duty with the 392nd, he was in Ferry Command at Memphis, Tennessee.

Discharged in 1946, he was recalled in 1951, and was a navigator in TAC until 1957 and then he took a degree in meteorology at Florida State and became a Weather Officer. He served in Korea, Japan and Florida, retiring as Major in 1967.

As a civilian, he farmed and taught math and science in junior high and high schools, picking up a master's degree in Education along the way. He retired in 1985.

Luther was on the original Board of Directors of the 392nd BG Memorial Association.

Luther and wife Lucile have 2 daughters, 2 sons, and 4 grandchildren. They live at Rte. 1, Box 59, Benoit, Mississippi 38725.

Profile

Anybody that knows J. D. Long is aware that God didn't intend for him to be a bomber pilot; he really wanted him to be a fighter pilot. In fact, J. D. was actually assigned to the 439th Fighter Sqdn., but through the vagaries of the Service, he wound up in the 392nd as the co-pilot of the Schildknect crew in Oct. 1943, in the 578th Sqdn.

Flying 33 missions, the 30th on D-Day, he was rotated back to the States, and went on inactive duty in July 1945.

Marrying Emily only after he was able to convince her that he could hold down a real job, he was in various management positions with Burlington Industries and the Charles S. Tanner Company until he retired in 1978.

J. D. is presently a Director of the 392nd's Memorial Association.
