And we all shared together the bad days when things did not go as planned --- when not all of our planes returned.

REUNION



PROFILES

Lawrence G. Gilbert, a native of Angola, Indiana, studied aeronautical engineering, 1938-1940, at Tri State College, Angola, where he learned to fly in the C A A pilot training program. He entered Air Corps cadet training in Feb. '41 at San Antonio, Texas, and on graduation, was assigned to a B-18 bomb group in Orlando, Fla. Along came Pearl Harbor, pandemonium, and a period of anti-sub operations in B-18s in Palm Beach, patrolling from North Carolina to Key West.

In early 1942, Gil was transferred to the 34th Bomb Group at Pendleton, Oregon, instructing fledgling B-17 crews for newly forming groups. Major Curtis Lemay was Group Operations Officer; 1st Lt. Irvine Rendle was Gilbert's squadron commander. This duty continued until Feb. '43 when he joined the 392nd along with Lt.Col.Rendle, its first commander, at Tucson.

After training with the group at El Paso and Alamogordo, he flew to England in July '43 with an advance party for indoctrination and to prepare Wendling for arrival of the main body. Gilbert served as Group Operations Officer, Deputy Commander, and Group Commander, flying 26 missions, including two with B-17 units prior to the arrival of the 392nd. He returned with the Group to the U.S. on the Queen Mary, June 1945.

From 1945 until retirement in 1961 Gilbert served in various command and staff assignments in MATS, including 6 months with the Berlin Air Lift and a two year tour in the Philippines. Since retirement, he has lived happily in Winter Park, Florida with high school classmate and spouse, Marjorie keeping busy with citrus interests, two children and four grandchildren.

We are fortunate to have Colonel Gilbert serving as the 1st president of the 392nd Bomb Group Memorial Association.

Cost per person: Single Occupancy - \$405.00 Double Occupancy - \$315.00 per person If you wish to share a room, let me know and I will try to come up with a partner.

For guaranteed reservations: Full payment by June 10th

Cancellations: Full refund if written notice received no later than July 1st.

Reservations: Not accepted without deposit. If full payment is not received by June 10, reservation will be cancelled and no refund will be made.

Extra nights: Pay directly to hotel - \$78.00 per night +6% tax.

Parking: Free. There is plenty of room for RV's, but no electrical hookup.

We have 400 rooms reserved at Pheasant Run. We also have available at a nearby motel approximately 100 additional rooms. Reservations will be made on a first come first served basis.

United Air Lines: United Air Lines has been designated as our official airline for this convention.

They will provide a special discount fare to Chicago O'Hare Airport from July 6-15.

They will award 2 tickets to any destination in the United States as a prize drawing for those who book reservations through their toll free number 800-521-4041 (8:30 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. EST, 7 days a week). Use Account No. 643K when ordering direct or through your travel agent.

From O'Hare to Pheasant Run: Call (312) 584-6300 and ask for transportation desk (ext. 7704). Advise airport, airline, date and time of arrival and they will make arrangements for van pickup. Cost \$10.00 per person, minimum 3 passengers, less than 3, \$15.00 per person, one way. Pickup point is between United and TWA on the lower level at the second curb. All vans are tan and brown with Pheasant Run Resort logo. All reservations must be made in advance. Do not call me, call Pheasant Run Resort.

THE 392ND STORY

It is estimated that at least 5,000 men served in the 392nd Bomb Group during our stay at Wendling. Of that number, 1,500 or so lost their lives during the war. This left about 3,500 of us who survived. Insurance actuaries would estimate that another 1,000 or so have passed on. This leaves about 2,500 of us. We have been able to locate about 650 of these men; there are still 1,850, or 74%, unaccounted for. As you can see, we haven't even scratched the surface!

It would seem to me that those of us who have survived this long have an obligation to those 1,500 young men who gave their lives. Do we not also have an obligation to future generations to tell them what we did and why we did it? It is important for them to understand the price that was paid for our victory.

We are now all 60 or older. Time is truly of the essence. The Grim Reaper seems to be working a little faster. Sometimes, I suspect, he is putting in a little overtime!

Our monument in Wendling is a reminder to the young people in England. We need to establish a small trust that will guarantee perpetual care for this memorial. The memorial in Dayton, Ohio will have such care. We need your input on how we can perpetuate the 392nd story! This will be discussed in our membership meeting in St. Charles, Ill. during the 2nd Air Division Assoc. Reunion. Do you have any ideas on this subject? We would like to hear from you.

Our membership drive has gone quite well and we are on schedule to meet our goal of 300 paid members by July and 400 by the end of our first year. Our first mailing of 350 letters went out on December 16, 1985. As of May 1, 1986, we have 260 members.

We have coordinators in several states, but are in need of volunteers in other areas. We badly need coordinators for Mass., Wis., Ohio, Illinois, Minn., Texas, and Calif. As a state coordinator, you are furnished a list of names and addresses in your state. The ones who have already signed up are great candidates to help you in contacting others on your list. Some coordinators are already planning informal get togethers in their areas. This is not hard work, and is most gratifying when you bring one into the fold. We also give you a master mailing list. When you contact someone, you also

ask for other names and addresses, e.g.crew members, people with whom you worked. All can be checked against the master list to see if it is one we already have. If not, we will add it to our list. Remember, there are still 1,850 men to be located! If a coordinator has been assigned to your state, get in touch with him and offer to help. Do I hear any coordinator volunteers?

If you haven't mailed in your 1986 dues, do it today. We need your support!
