392ND'S WEB SITE A FAVORITE ON THE INTERNET

Bob Books, web master of the Group's web site, b24.net, reports that the Group's site is one of the most heavily visited WWII sites on the internet.

He reports that the site has just passed 50,000 visits, not counting the ones that go directly to the POW section, which is about another 7,000. The site is running about 750-800 visits per week.

"THE LONGEST DAY" IS ETCHED IN THE MINDS OF THE CRUSADERS: THREE MISSIONS WITH 80 A/C AND 800 AIRMEN COMMITTED TO THE INVASION BATTLE

The events of the day that was the turning point of WWII in Europe are virtually lost to present generations, but the Crusaders who were at Wendling that day remember it as if it were yesterday.

We had been in England for nearly a year attacking the Nazis from the air, taking tremendous losses in men and materiel and sometimes wondering if the effort was in vain.

So when the news of the long-awaited invasion of Nazi held Europe reached us on the afternoon of June 5, the base was galvanized into action. We were eager to throw the weight of our bombers into the effort.

The 392nd struck three times that day, beginning with the take-off of 36 a/c at 0240; 12 launched at 0600; and 22 launched at 1300. The last returning ship landed at around 2100, making it truly "the longest

day."

Col Lawrence Gilbert, the last commander of the 392nd and now the CEO of the Memorial Association, led the first mission as command pilot. His memory of the mission follows:

"Our target was the coastal gun batteries zeroed in on Omaha Beach. As we crossed the channel at 15,000 feet we had a fairly good view of the vast armada of ships standing off shore. From several miles out we could see the beach. As we came closer, well before bomb release point, cloud cover intervened preventing visual bomb sighting. We dropped our bomb load on the smoke flares of the Pathfinder aircraft. Our return to base was uneventful, although one of our flights reported being fired upon by friendly ships in the channel."

We are enclosing a pamphlet in the hopes that Crusaders can put it into the hands of potential members, be they veterans or descendants of veterans.



MUSINGS FROM THE EDITOR



THE LEGACY OF THE MIGHTY EIGHTH AIR FORCE

The Eighth Air Force was activated in January 1942 in Savannah, Georgia and was charged with carrying the air war to the enemy in the European Theater of Operations. Their mission was to destroy vital industries and transportation facilities of the Nazi oppressors and thereby neutralize their warmaking capability. They were also tasked to secure air superiority in order to permit allied ground troops to land in Europe and liberate countries occupied by German forces. The servicemen of the Mighty Eighth successfully accomplished these missions. Since 1942 the Eighth Air Force has epitomized values important to our country and become a true legacy in American history.



Before World War II ended 350,000 Americans served in the Eighth Air Force, stationed at over fiftyfive airbases in England. The 8th Air Force was the largest air force ever assembled and committed to battle. The Eighth airmen suffered the greatest number of casualities of any single American military unit - over 26,000 8th Air Force airmen were killed in action and another 28,000 fliers were taken prisoner after being shot down over enemy territories. The Eighth Air Force never once was turned back by enemy forces on any combat mission they flew. Its tradition of excellence has continued throughout all of America's conflicts, including the Cold War, the Korean War, Vietnam, the Panama Just Cause Operation, the Persian Gulf War, and the Kosovo air campaign.

Ben Jones has undertaken the task of supplying the 392BGMA with the leather Crusader patches that started appearing on the Group's A-2 jackets in 1944

Ben says: these patches are handpainted on genuine fine leather to meet the same specifications of WWII. As the war progressed various hand painted Group patches started appearing on A-2 jackets. As there was no standard size among the various Groups, Hq. USAAF authorized the use of a 5" circular leather patch on which the unit logo could be painted.

The Crusader is drawn on a USAAF approved 5" circular leather patch. Each patch is unique with no two being identical, as with mass produced copies. You can choose between a distressed look or a freshly painted look.

The logo is painted on the leather, then coated with a sealant that protects it. Like any leather, it is suggested that it not get wet.

The cost is \$20 plus shipping and handling.

PROFILE

Cpl Thomas H. Perry was in the Ordnance section of the 576th. He joined the 392nd at Biggs Field in April 1943.

Perry told the NEWS that he was sent to the RAF armament school where he qualified as a Spitfire armorer, but the closest he every came to a Spitfire after that was when one flew over Wendling.

After the war, he took the BS degree from Greenville College, Greenville, IL and the MS degree from the University of Illinois. He taught English, Mathematics, and Science before becoming Principal of the high school at Brownstown, IL.

In 1952 he left the education field and worked in accounting and finance in the construction industry as an internal auditor. He worked at such diverse construction sites as skyscrapers, petrochemical plants and nuclear power plants in over 15 states and in Canada.

His wife Maria is deceased. They have three sons and a daughter; and five grandsons and one granddaughter.


