392nd MEMORIAL DEDICATION NOV. 7

MIGHTY 8AF MUSEUM AT SAVANNAH SCENE OF GROUP GATHERING

A 2/3 scale replica of the Group's Wendling Memorial is now installed at the Mighty 8AF Museum at Savannah, GA. Col Lawrence Gilbert, Association CEO, announced that the formal dedication will take place at 11 A. M. on Nov. 7. Luncheon at the Museum will follow.

The Museum is just off 1-95 at the Pooler exit.

Association headquarters will be at the Hampton Inn, I-95 at exit 19, about 5 miles north of the Pooler exit. For reservations, call toll free 1 888 95 426 7866 (You must use the "95"; it gets you this particular Hampton Inn). Ask for Sean (pronounced Shawn) Peck, and identify yourself as belonging to the 392nd. A reduced rate has been promised.

There will be a hospitality room at the Hampton Inn, open Nov. 6 and 7.

(There are two Hampton Inns- we will be at the one at exit 19.)

There are other motels in the vicinity.

GENERAL KEPNER HONORED BY GRISSOM AIR MUSEUM

Lt/Gen William E. Kepner was Commanding General of the 2AD, 8AF, in WWII. Born in 1893, he died in 1982 at the age of 89.

On Oct. 5, 1997, the Grissom Air Museum dedicated a Kepner exhibition. He was a native of the area, born in a log cabin only a few miles from the museum, which is on the site of the closed Grissom AF Base. (Grissom is about 65 miles north of Indianapolis, IN.)

Family, military associates, and friends participated in the ceremonies. Letters describing incidents in his life, written by Crusaders Cliff Peterson and Col Lawrence Gilbert, were read. Jim Goar attended as a representative of 392BG, 2AD, and 8AF.

Gen Kepner ran away from home and joined the Marines at the age of 16. He served with them in the Phillippines.

In 1916 he joined the National Guard as a 2/Lt and served on the Mexican Border. In WWI, he was in the Army, commanding a battalion and earning the Purple Heart in the Meuse-Argonne battle.

Transferring after WWI to what became the Army Air Corps, he was a pioneer in military aviation, flying not only fixed-wing a/c but also lighterthan-air. GENERATIONS 2 AND 3 FLY IN B-24

The McGuires are son and grandson of 2/Lt William C. McGuire, navigator on the Sharpe crew in the 579th, lost over Friedrichshafen March 18, 1944.

Bill II has become intensely interested in WWII, especially the part played by his father with the 392nd. He has done much research and has linked up with Jim Marsteller, another second generation researcher. He has become an associate member of the 392BGMA, and attended the 8AF reunion at Minneapolis in September.

1/Lt Wesley A. Schafer was a first pilot in the 578th, arriving at Wendling in late March, 1944. His crew survived two bail-outs; one on 29 May 1944 over England, and one on 20 June over Sweden.

He was a troop carrier pilot in the AF Reserves for 1948 to 1951. After that he was an air traffic controller, retiring in 1973.

MEET DAN McGOVERN, COMBAT CAMERAMAN

Tall, lanky, soft-spoken Dan Mc-Govern filmed the proceedings at our landmark Albuquerque stand-alone reunion. He also can be seen at every meeting of the 8AF Historial Society, faithfully getting the events on film.

Although he served in the ETO with the 305th Bomb Group, he is an associate member of the 392BGMA.

Recently the American Movie Channel aired the film, "Hollywood Commandos", the story of the AAF's First Motion Picture Unit, which during the war produced many training and promotion films for the AAF. McGovern was a part of the First Motion Picture unit in Hollywood, and had an important speaking part in the TV film.

He left the First Motion Picture unit for service with the 305th, where he flew combat missions as a cameraman. He participated in documentation of such films as "Memphis Belle, "Target for Today", and "Target Germany". While at that duty he received a field combat commission.

In January 1944 he was invalided

home, and after recovery rejoined the First Motion Picture unit for duty in the Pacific. He was at Guam, Tinian, Siapan, and Iwo Jima.

He had just finished the film "The Last Bomb", when Japan surrendered. He then went to Japan as a part of the US Strategic Bombing Survey.

Dan retired from the Air Force as Lt/Col.

PROFILE

T/Sgt Harris B. Albright was a member of the John E. Ross crew in the 576th. They arrived at Wendling in September 1944.

In civilian life, Harris was at Howard Hughes Corporation for 27 years as property manager. He retired in 1982.

He and spouse Dorothy live at 2507 North Trevino Place, Mesa, AZ 85215. They have three children and nine grand-children.


